PICK-A-TIME

Update

In 2016, we began using an online process of scheduling Parent-Teacher interviews.

Due to the positive reception of this process, we have continued with it yearly. I have heard many comments of approval from parents appreciating the ease of scheduling and coordinating times to the convenience of their choosing.

I set up this event, posted the notices in the Journal and had the office send reminder emails sent to parents who had not scheduled times. I provided teachers with a link for them to check their schedules in the weeks prior. I also made sure that schedules were printed, posted and given to teachers. While approximately five families did not schedule interviews that evening, several contacted the school or teachers to arrange a time on a different date. This program definitely has eliminated the majority of no-shows that used to happen.

Continuing Review

I have continued to investigate the
Bible program. It was discovered that
the former PACS does not offer Bible
curriculum for Grades 5 and 6 (or any
other grade besides Grades 7 through
9). PCCE has a new
outline/philosophy for teaching Bible
that could emcompass the whole
school. CSI also has a
revamped version of
the current Bible
curriculum.

The results/findings of the pros and cons of these programs were presented to the Program Committee. Since Grade 5/6 had ordered a sample of the program, a decision was made with this committee to allow Joanne to pilot the curriculum for this year. I have touched base with her recently and she is pleased with the process thus far. It is probably early to determine its success, but it seems postive.

I am recommending that samples be ordered for all the other grades to arrive in January to discuss with the staff during the professional development day that is upcoming. This will allow teachers to have input into making a recommendation for how to proceed with this going forward.
